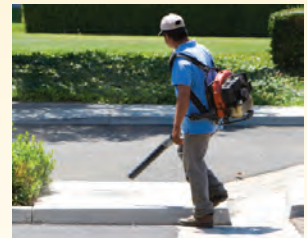

### Focus Topic: Debris Disposal

#### > Please Be Responsible for Proper Disposal of Yard Debris

- Yard debris clogs storm drains and drainage ditches, which increases the risk of flooding and property damage.
- Blow yard waste back onto landscaped area, not onto the street, in storm drain or waterway.
- Use grass clippings and leaves for natural fertilizer or compost for mulch, to provide nutrients to the soil and reduce need for fertilizer.
- Collect and bag yard waste for collection by City Environmental Services.
- Keep all drains and drainage ditches free of obstructions.

#### > Adopt-A-Stream Program

The Adopt-A-Stream Program is looking for volunteer groups to walk, clean, and protect streams in Wilson. The program allows groups to adopt stream segments for 2-year periods. ## Economical Tips

### > Fertilizer Education

Fertilizing your yard for the Spring/Summer Seasons? Here are some tips to save time and money!

- Don't fertilize prior to immediate rain. The fertilizer will just wash away and so will your \$\$\$.
- Leave your grass clippings for fertilizer and soil nutrients.
- Have a free soil test done to save time & money by knowing the exact application type and amount for your lawn. Soil kits are available at the Wilson County Ag Center, 1806 Goldsboro Street, SW.
- Read and follow label directions prior to spreading fertilizer.
- When fertilizer washes out of your yard and/or off the sidewalks into streams and drains, the oxygen is taken away from the water— which is necessary for fish to survive.
