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TIPS FOR MOTORISTS

- Motorists must stop for pedestrians in all crosswalks. There are crosswalks at every street intersection—whether they are marked on the pavement or not.
- When making a left turn, a driver is often focused on on-coming traffic. Be careful to look for pedestrians before you make a left turn, especially when crossing multiple lanes.
- When turning right at a red light, be sure to look for pedestrians who are crossing with the “Walk” signal.
- Use caution when passing another vehicle that is stopped at an intersection. They may be stopped for a pedestrian you cannot see.
- When crossing or entering a street, be sure to look for pedestrians on both sides of the sidewalk to your right and left.
- Always drive at or below the speed limit.

TIPS FOR PEDESTRIANS

- Cross the street only at intersections
- Use marked crosswalks where available
- Do not cross in the middle of the street or between parked cars
- Make eye contact with drivers when crossing busy streets
- Always check for turning vehicles before stepping off the curb
- Avoid walking in traffic where there are no sidewalks or crosswalks—If you have to walk on a road that does not have sidewalks, walk facing traffic
- Wear bright colors or reflective clothing at night—Carry a flashlight when walking in the dark
- Use extra caution when crossing multiple lane, higher speed streets
